GREEN TIP

Hedges are a great way to capture carbon, so it is worth seeing if a hedge in
or around your churchyard could replace a fence. A neatly trimmed hedge
looks better than a fence and is easier to maintain. Again, it is worth working
with local farmers to see if there are hedgerows that could be restored.
Farmers can now get grants to restore hedges or plant new ones. Planting
should be done between November and March, so now is the time to start
planning new planting.
