After last summer's heatwaves and droughts many of us who garden need to be thinking seriously about how we can adapt our gardening to suit what climate change is throwing at us.

Plant a more drought resistant lawn with a good mix of wildflowers. The RHS has developed, with Monty Don, a lawn combining only a hard-wearing grass seed and daisies, dandelions and clover.
